

Report on the National Service Scheme (NSS) Units at Govt. College, Barwala (Hisar)

The National Service Scheme is a Central sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's centenary year in 1969. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service.

Motto of NSS

The motto or watchword of the National Service Scheme is "NOT ME BUT YOU".

NSS Symbol



The NSS symbol is based on the "Rath" wheel of the Konark Sun Temple situated in Odisha.

The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind. The Red colour in the badge indicates that the NSS volunteers are full of blood i.e. lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycle of creation, preservation and release, and signify the movement in life across time and space.

Structure and Strength of NSS Units in Govt. College Barwala (Hisar)

The college operates **two NSS units**, each functioning independently under the college administration. Each unit has a capacity of **100 student volunteers**, resulting in a total strength of **200 NSS volunteers** across both units.

The units are managed by dedicated faculty members who serve as NSS Program Officers (Conveners and Co-Conveners).

Financial Administration and Grant Allocation

All billing and financial documentation for both NSS Unit 1 and Unit 2 is processed and managed by **Mr. Devender Lohan (Clerk)**. The government provides specific grants to each NSS unit for two primary categories of activities: Special Camping and Regular Activities.

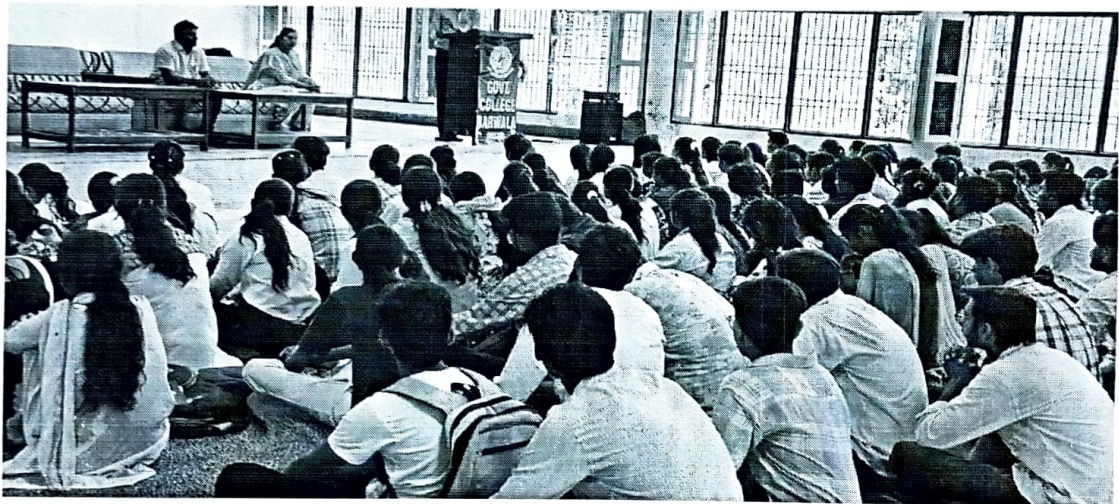

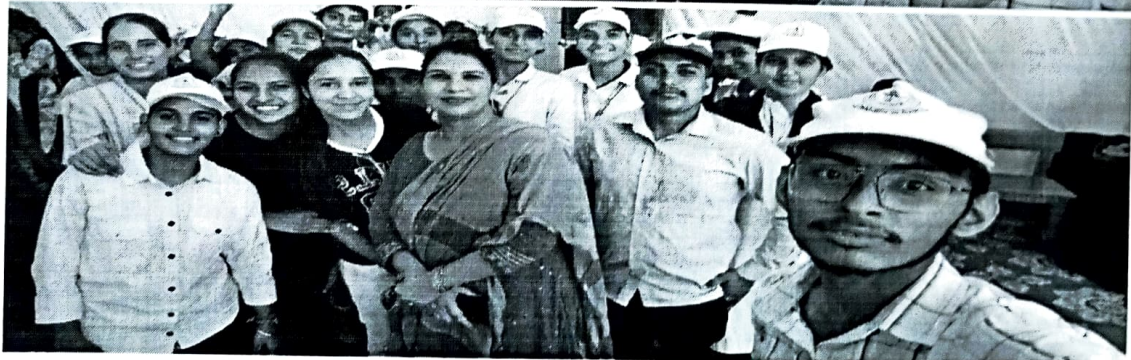
Talent Search Duty Report of NSS Volunteers on September 27, 2025

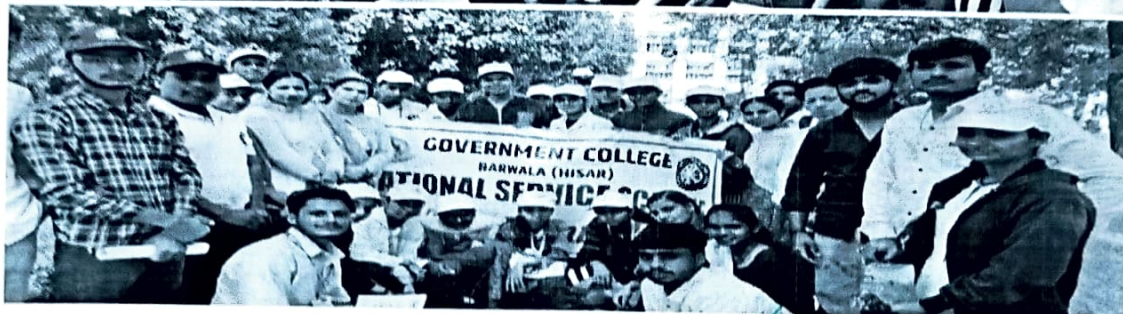

Report on NSS One-Day Camp on 13 Nov 2025


NSS Activity: Tree Plantation and Cleanliness Campaign

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit successfully organized a joint tree plantation and cleanliness campaign on 13 Nov 2025, demonstrating its commitment to environmental protection and community service. The program began with an inspiring address by the Principal/Program Officer, who highlighted the importance of trees and their role in combating global warming. A total of 10 saplings, including neem, peepal, Ashoka, and fruit trees, were planted in the designated area. Volunteers were divided into groups.
